This planting will be particularly important for habitat creation and enhancement in the Patch for the benefit of the animals and other wildlife already there, and to attract more in - both in terms of actual numbers and the number of species.

"Our living landscape vision is set for another step forward on Saturday 9th March 2019 when Madeleine's Patch volunteers will help plant 1,000 hedging plants to grow into green corridors and shelter/nesting habitat for a wide range of species. Varieties of plants include the beautiful spindle and dog rose both of which provide nectar and other food sources for a wide range of insects, small mammals and birds. Thanks to those of you have already volunteered to assist with the planting but more volunteers are needed and even if you cannot do the physical work, a helping hand heating the soup and buttering the rolls for the hungry helpers would go down a treat. A great day out in the fresh air for all the family with a positive outcome in the company of fellow country lovers. What could be better?"

An afternoon, 1-4pm, of learning about the Mammal Society's new app, Mammal Mapper (https://www.mammal.org.uk/volunteering/mammal-mapper/). Frazer Coomber, the Mammal Society's scientific officer, will be leading a session designed to give us how an insight into how we can make the most of this app.

Event description

The Mammal Mapper is designed to record information on the location and number of animals spotted on walks or bicycle rides. This session will be an opportunity for group members to get more information on the app a swell as hands on experience. Frazer will be delivering a classroom session to explain more about how to use the app. This will be held in the stables located near the main building at the site. This classroom session will be followed by a walk around Wandlebury to practice using the app. Frazer will be on hand throughout to answer any questions.

Extraordinary General Meeting Day and date: Monday 11 March 2019 Venue: St John's Church Hall, Hills Rd, Cambridge CB2 8RN

Event description Changes to the Mammal Group Constitution

⁴1 - the provision for EGMs and for quorums (quora?) for them and AGMs - these are new and hopefully selfexplanatory. EGMs of course enable us to change the Constitution rather quicker than annually! And we had no minimum number of attendees for AGMs (one-fifth of the membership is the quorum in the new Constitution for EGMs and AGMs).

2 - 'rotation' of some officer posts - this is the main matter.

Membership of clubs and societies is declining in the UK. One of the reasons for this is a lack of people willing to stand for positions of responsibility, such as chairperson, treasurer etc. In all too many groups, becoming a club officer is a lifetime commitment for the individual (and their families!). Post holders can often be unwilling to resign as there is a fear that no one will want to replace them, and hence the group may fold.

Restricting (some) Group officers to an initial maximum of three years 'service' has many advantages. It should encourage more people to volunteer. A (maximum of a) three year stint is long enough to 'make your mark' but also short enough to fit into a modern lifestyle. It should encourage more applications from those who want to make a

difference but who do not want to be stuck in a post or, for example, who are concerned that future career and family changes would make it impossible for them to continue in the role. The proposed changes to the constitution allow an officer who's done their maximum of three years to stand for another post while having an enforced break from their previous post as, under normal circumstances and as would be started in the Addendum, all of the key officials would not be replaced in the same year. If all the three posts under consideration did have to be filled by new people in the same year - a lack of continuity and the potential for confusion and disaster. These changes should therefore allow those few who want and are able to undertake long service as a Group officer to do so (albeit not in the same role all the time) while also encouraging the appointment of completely new post holders and thereby the influx of new ideas while retaining the best of our traditions and current practices.

WANDLEBURY WILDLIFE DAY

Dates: (23 and) 24 March 2019

Venue: Wandlebury, Gog Magog Hills, Babraham, Cambridge

<u>Further details</u> Overnight (from 5.30pm on Saturday 23 March) small mammal trapping and opening (from 8am on Sunday 24 March) of traps followed by showing of some of the trapped animals and of Group display material to the general public attending the event itself - which is from 11am to 3.30pm that day. Volunteers needed for the trapping sessions and for the publicity session.

Event description The intention is to do some overnight small mammal trapping around Wandlebury Ring and nearby, open the traps (from 8am on 24 March) and keep some animals in tanks on display for a few hours having reset some traps, opening the traps again (with members of the public) to replace the displayed animals, and removing the traps We should gain some more records for the next Mammal Atlas from both areas trapped - we have few small mammal records from this area.

The detail from CPPF (Wandlebury) on its publicity material for 24 March reads: "Join us as we explore the habitats of Wandlebury and the wildlife that call it home. Learn from interactive displays and talks from our conservation partners, and meet the team that works to protect and safeguard Wandlebury's Wildlife." <u>Further details</u> Overnight (from 7pm Saturday 27 April 2019) small mammal trapping and opening (at 7.30am Sunday 28 April 2019) of traps followed by showing of some of the trapped animals and of Group display material to the general public attending the event - until say 1pm. Volunteers needed for the trapping sessions and for the publicity session.

Event description
